

Town Chairperson's Message

Dean Town Resident,

The Town of Lawrence was established in 1847, which makes us the first town in Brown County. This year marks 175 years! The Town of Lawrence is named after Amos Adams Lawrence. Amos was a businessman, philanthropist and social activist from Boston, Massachusetts. He purchased 5,000 acres in the Fox Valley area which then in 1847 he pledged \$10,000 to endow Lawrence University (originally called Lawrence Institute).

In the 1850 census, the Town had 256 people. After 100 years, the population was 1,220. Fast forward to today, our population is 6,284. As history has proven, Lawrence continues to be a growing, progressive community in both residential and economic development.



We are fortunate to have assets that contribute to the growth. Strategic location, stable tax base, quality protective and maintenance services, supportive residents and community leadership are to name a few. Our strong sense of community pride promotes an atmosphere conducive to a better quality of life.

We are extremely fortunate to have quality education in our area. We also have quality sports and recreation facilities. Lawrence Parkway has great potential for additional recreation, business, and residential opportunities. We are engaging a Town Bicycle & Pedestrian plan Committee in conjunction with Brown County Planning to provide safe, functional structures. I am excited for the future of the Town with the planning of additional projects!

We are fortunate have great protective services. A study of the Fire Department was recently completed, and we will be implementing/planning for future improvements and developments. The Hobart-Lawrence Police Department has added a Captain, Sergeant, and an additional officer to provide leadership on the road and department. Our ambulance service is coordinated with De Pere and provides quality service. A special thank you to all our protective services staff!

As you drive through the Town, you will notice certain roads are currently or have been recently paved. To continue to keep our roads safe, we will continue to budget annually for these improvements. The Interstate 41 project is scheduled to begin in 2025. This project will improve the traffic flow from the Fox Valley to Scheuring Road.

We invite you to attend our Food Truck Rally at Quarry Park on Sunday, June 26th from 4:00pm – 8:00pm. All proceeds will benefit our Lawrence Fire Department. This a great community event to support our Fire Department. K-9 merchandise will also be available for sale which will benefit the Hobart-Lawrence Police K-9 program.

Know The Deadlines

Voter Registration

July 20, 2022

<u>Deadline to register by Mail</u> – Your voter registration form, along with proof of residence must be postmarked no later than July 20, 2022

<u>Deadline to Register to vote online</u> – Voters who are able to match their name, date of birth, Wisconsin Driver License or State ID number and address with the Wisconsin DMV can register to vote online through July 20, 2022.

August 5, 2022

<u>Deadline to register in the Clerk's office</u> – Voters may register in-person at the clerk's office during business hours Monday-Friday 8:00am-4:00pm and until **5:00pm** on August 5, 2022

August 9, 2022

Register to Vote at your polling place – Voters can register to vote at their polling place on Election Day, August 9, 2022 from **7:00am-8:00pm**.

Absentee Voting

August 4, 2022

<u>Deadline to Request an Absentee Ballot</u>-Regular & Permanent Overseas Voters – If you are a regular or a Permanent Overseas Voter, your absentee ballot request must be received by the Clerk's office no later than **5:00pm** on August 4, 2022

August 5, 2022

<u>Deadline to Request an Absentee Ballot-Indefinitely Confined, Military (Active & Not Active), and Calendar year</u> – your absentee ballot request must be received by the Clerk's office no later than **5:00pm** on August 5, 2022

<u>Deadline for Hospitalized or Sequestered Voters and Active Duty Away Military</u> – Voters who are in a hospital may request a ballot be brough to them by an appointed agent if they are hospitalized in the 7 days preceding the election. You may request a ballot between August 2, 2022, and August 9, 2022 at **5:00pm**.

<u>Deadline for In-Person Absentee</u> – Voters can request and vote an absentee ballot in-person in the clerk's office through 5:00pm August 5, 2022

August 9, 2022 @ 5:00pm

<u>Deadline to Request an Absentee Ballot-Military</u> – If you are a voter in the military, your absentee ballot request must be received by the Clerk's office no later than **5:00pm** on August 9, 2022,

<u>Deadline to Return Absentee Ballot</u> – If you have already received an absentee ballot, you must return your absentee ballot by mail or delivery to the Clerk's office. Your ballot must be received by **8:00pm** on August 9, 2022

YARD WASTE REMINDER

Grass clippings, leaves, branches, and garden waste materials are accepted. PLEASE DUMP DIRECTLY NEXT TO OR ON THE EXISTING PILE.

We do not accept stones/rocks, sod, firewood, or tree stumps.

The Yard Waste Facility is for Town Residents ONLY. Please obtain a sticker from the Town Hall <u>PRIOR</u> to use of the facility.

The Town Yard Waste Facility is located in front of the Town Hall/behind the Fire Department.

The vard waste is monitored by video surveillance cameras

<u>HOMEOWNER TIP</u>

Homeowners are responsible for the sewer line that extends from the interior of their property to the road right a way. Here are some tips to make sure your sewer line is performing at its best:


- Don't flush things that can't be put down the drain. This includes wipes of any kind, including socalled "flushable" wipes, grease, toys, etc.
- Have your sewers cleaned every six months for lines made of plastic and more often for older lines made of clay.
- If a backup or any other sewer issues occur, call Town Hall at (920) 336-9131

TRASH & RECYCLING

Garbage and recycling bins must be placed curbside no earlier than 6:00 PM the evening before collection and no later than 6:00 AM on collection day.

Keep your bins 4 feet apart and at least 4 feet from any obstacles such as mailboxes, cars, lamp posts or power lines.

HOW TO AVOID A SCAM

- ✓ Block unwanted calls and text messages take steps to block unwanted calls and/or text messages
- ✓ Don't give your personal or financial information in response to a request that you didn't expect. legitimate organizations won't call, email or text to ask for personal information. DO NOT click on links in emails or text messages even if it is from a company you do business with. Instead, contact them using a trustworthy website or look up their number.
- ✓ Know how scammers tell you to pay – Never pay someone who insists you pay with a gift card, money transfer service or send money back to someone after you deposited a check.
- Report all scams to the Hobart/Lawrence Police Department and Federal Trade Commission.

SUMMER CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

The Hobart/Lawrence Police Department would like to offer these crime prevention reminders to keep you and your family safe during the spring months:

- Keep your doors and windows locked at your home. If you are working in the backyard, keep your front door and garage doors closed and locked. Keep your back doors locked, if you are in the front yard. Criminals look for all opportunities.
- Spring is usually a time when homeowners like to open windows and patio doors when they are home. Always remember to close and lock windows and doors before leaving home or going to sleep.
- If you go on vacation, put some lights on timers so they will turn off and on by themselves to give the appearance that someone is home. Have a friend or neighbor pick up your newspaper or mail daily.
- Be sure to roll up your car windows, take all valuables out of the vehicle and lock your doors every time you exit the vehicle, even if it is in your driveway.
- Be aware of home improvement scams. If a solicitor shows up at your door unannounced, do not do business with them. Be cautious of anyone who offers to repair your home at very low prices or requests cash up front prior to completion of their work. Don't be afraid to call the company for verification. Make sure you have a secure locked door between you and the possible solicitors.
- o If a utility worker comes to your door, ask for identification.
- Being a good neighbor is the best crime prevention tool!
 Watchful and attentive neighbors can spot criminals and alert police of their presence.

EASEMENTS DOS AND DON'TS

Easements are in place to protect areas of land that are important for infrastructure and/or drainage of stormwater. One function of a plan review for all building permits is to identify easements that exist on a property to ensure they are protected. If you need help identifying easements on your property, call the Building/Zoning department at (920) 347-3715.



- MAINTAIN the drainage easement as your lawn as much as practical. During wet times it may not be possible to mow. However, mowing and weed whacking should be performed as field conditions allow.
- NOTIFY the Building/Zoning department if you observe anyone filling, obstructing, or otherwise blocking/altering the land in a Town drainage easement
- CONSTRUCT A SILT FENCE along drainage easement line if you are during work near the easement involving soil disturbance.

DON'T 🚫

- FILL, OBSTRUCT, OR MATERIALLY ALTER THE Town drainage easement or permit an impediment in the drainage easement to remain
- CONSTRUCT OR PLACE improvements such as pools, fences, sheds, or other structures in the Town drainage easement. Also, do not install temporary obstacles which cannot be easily moved such as swing sets. These may impede the flow of water within the easement.
- MODIFY the existing topography to RESTRICT the flow of stormwater within the easement.
- **DISPOSE** of brush, grass clippings, leaves, or other such materials within the easements.

The Eleazer Williams marker was erected in 1961 on the land that was left to his wife Madeline Jourdain in which their house once stood. Williams was believed to be the "Lost Dauphin" after a visit from a French Prince in 1841.

Lost Dauphin Park is located along the Fox River on Lost Dauphin Road in the Town.
