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
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WINTER PARKING REGULATIONS

2023 Comprehensive Plan

The 2023 update to the Town Comprehensive Plan is currently underway. The goal of this plan is to shape a vision for the future of the Town of Lawrence and identify long-range goals and objectives related to community elements such as land use, transportation, utility infrastructure, economic development, quality of life, housing, parks, and more. The Comprehensive Plan will be developed over the next 10-12 months through ideas and feedback from the community, existing conditions analysis, and professional direction. A Resident Advisory Committee has been developed to assist in this process as well.

The Town has chosen the Brown County Planning Commission to facilitate the planning process for the plan, which will include several opportunities for community engagement. These opportunities will include online survey, visioning session public meeting, and an online outreach map.

On Tuesday, March 7, 2023, at 6:00pm, we will be hosting a public meeting where Town residents can attend at any point during the meeting time and stay as long as they are able to. This will be an opportunity for residents to share their vision for the future of the Town of Lawrence. We invite all Town residents, business owners, landowners, employees, students, and other groups take part in this process.



Spring Cleaning Safety Checklist

Fire Extinguishers: Check expiration date & test it

Clean out dryer lint trap and exhaust

Check roof and gutters for debris and damage

☐ Air Conditioner: schedule service/cleaning

Inspect electrical appliances for damaged/frayed cords


House numbers visible from street

Make sure all doors/windows open easily for fast escapes

Review family escape plan in case of fire

Check propane grills for hose leaks and cracks

Check flashlights and battery powered radio are working for severe weather

Bicycle & Pedestrian Safety

As the warmer days approach, it is important to know how drivers and bicyclists can work together to keep each other safe. Drivers, look for and expect to see pedestrians and bicycles on the road. Double check blind spots before making turns, changing lanes, opening car doors, and backing out of your driveways. Slow down and limit distractions while driving.

Bicyclists, before you dust of the bike for the first time, do an equipment and bicycle inspection. Wear bright and/or reflective clothing. If you plan on riding during dusk, dawn, or at night, be sure your bicycle is equipped with a white light in the front and a red light in the back.

K9 Bax Retirement


After six years on the police force, Bax, our hardworking canine is getting well-deserved rest in retirement. Bax joined HLPD in March 2016 at the age of 3.

He has presented at countless public demonstrations throughout his career. Bax has assisted in the removal of pounds of illegal narcotics throughout his career that span over 600 deployments. Approximately 400 ounces of marijuana, 80 ounces of methamphetamine, 48 ounces of cocaine and 16 ounces of heroin. He has also provided invaluable assistance to officers with helping secure over 55 apprehensions. Bax will be enjoying his retirement alongside Sgt. Tremel and his family.

The Hobart-Lawrence Police Department has already welcomed our new teammate: K9 Jax who will replace Bax.
